On March 11, 2020 Arizona Governor Doug Ducey issued a Declaration of Emergency and Executive Order to provide health officials and administrators tools and guidance necessary to combat COVID-19

On March 15, 2020 a statewide school closure was issued. It has been extended through the end of the school year.

On March 16, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 infection, the Town of Fredonia implemented "soft" closures to limit the possible exposure to the infection. This included closing town facilities to the public, including the Library, senior center, and the town office. All facilities are staffed, with the Library and Town Hall still taking calls, and town hall still processing any payments. The Senior Center is still delivering meals to seniors, practicing "knock and drop", with staff delivering meals, knocking at the front door, then waiting in the vehicle until the meal is retrieved. This will continue until further notice.

On March 17, 2020 gatherings of 10 or more people are cancelled or postponed, telework and other alternatives are recommended.

On March 18, 2020 Coconino County signed a resolution declaring a local emergency, allowing the County to make appropriate orders, provide emergency resources, request additional resources and receive mutual aid from state and federal governments. See the entire order [here](#).

On March 19, 2020, Governor Ducey issued order requiring restaurants in Arizona counties with confirmed COVID-19 cases to provide dine-out options only, and required all bars, gyms and movie theaters to close.

On March 30, 2020 Governor Ducey issued executive order Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected, limiting individuals time away from home except for essential activities. Essential employees are allowed to leave home for work, without providing documentation of activities. See the entire order [here](#).

On March 31, 2020 Fredonia Town Mayor Kimley Purvis executed a Declaration of Emergency for Fredonia. This declaration will allow the town to make appropriate orders, request additional resources and receive aid from state and federal agencies. This will also help provide emergency resources to the town. See entire order [here](#).

As of April 13, 2020, the Town of Fredonia is still implementing the "soft" closures of town facilities. Payments are still processed either on-line at www.fredoniaaz.net, by phone at 928-643-7241, or by dropping payments in the night depository. Phone calls are handled in the office as well. The Marshal Office is closed to the public, but can be reached by phone at 928-643-7241, in the event of an emergency, please call 911. The

Library continues to handle incoming calls at 928-643-7137 and the Senior Center continues to deliver meals. You can reach the Senior Center at 928-643-7278. Public Works is continuing to handle daily tasks, while maintaining social distancing requirements. There has been no and will continue to be no interruption in services provided, barring any unforeseen acts of nature or circumstances beyond control of the department. Town facilities closed include the park playground equipment, pool and restroom facilities at the park. The open spaces at the park remain open, and shall remain open as long as social distancing requirements are maintained. Care & Share continues to operate, making sure residents who are in need are receiving food. They have modified the operation to a drive-thru contactless service, however it continues to run smoothly.

Service stations in Fredonia remain open, with the 10 person limit being enforced by store staff. Hours have been modified.

Mayor Purvis and town staff continue to closely monitor the developing situation and will continue to take actions to preserve the health and safety of residents in the town.
