

Voter ID Required

Utah Election Laws now require every voter to provide valid voter identification before being allowed to vote.

If the voter is unable to provide such identification, they will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot and will have five (5) days following election day to provide valid voter identification to the County Clerk to make their Provisional Ballot countable.

Please show **(1)** one of the following (with a name, photo).

A currently valid:

- Utah driver license;
- ID card issued by the state; or a branch, department, or agency of the US government;
- Utah permit to carry a concealed weapon;
- United States passport; or
- Tribal identification card (with or without a photograph).

OR

Two **(2)** of the following showing name and at least one of them with the current address of the voter's place of residence within the voting precinct:

- Current utility bill, (dated within 90 days);
- Bank or financial statement;
- Certified birth certificate;
- Valid Social Security card;
- Check issued by the state or federal government;
- Paycheck from the voter's employer;
- Currently valid Utah hunting or fishing license;
- Currently valid US military ID card;
- Certified naturalization document;
- Currently valid license issued by an authorized agency of the U.S.;
- Certified copy of court records showing adoption or name change;
- Bureau of Indian Affairs card;
- Valid Medicaid, Medicare, or Electronic Benefits Transfer Card;
- Currently valid ID card issued by: local government within Utah; an employer; a college, university, technical or professional school located within Utah;
- Currently valid vehicle registration;
- or
- Any of single source documents above establishing, ID and residence within the voting precinct.
