Minutes of November 26, 2014 Meeting

Kane County Council on aging meeting, held Nov. 26, 2013 at the Kanab Senior Center. The meeting was called to order by Chairman Ken Wanlass at 1:00 p.m.

Members in attendance were Fayann Christensen, Wallace Gibson, Craig Hansen, Ila Mae Swapp, Ken Wanlass, Mary Craven, Mary Stevens, Norman Carroll, Doyle Swallow, and Jim Matson. Carol Sullivan was excused. Else Talboys was released from the Council. We need some new members on our Council.

Minutes of Aug. 14, 2013 were discussed. Motion to accept minutes was made by Doyle Swallow and seconded by Wally Gibson.

We had no report from Big Water.

Report from Commissioner Matson—Although, there has been a budget cut from both State and Federal monies. We will still be able to maintain both facilities, and add programs as needed. Fayann and Craig are doing a good job, at the centers. We will have to work out a plan when the road construction starts.

Report from Long Valley—Things are going well. Heather has renewed her Self Serve Certificate. Fayann will be glad to help the other people who need to get renewed.

Report from Kanab—Rumor is not true that the center will be moving to the old middle school. It would take time and money to update this building. Craig trapped the ring-tailed cats that were in the attic of the Kanab Center. He even showed pictures of the cats. The Kanab Van had a breakdown on the Hopi Trip. Craig spent one night and \$3500, mostly for towing, to get it fixed. Squirrels had chewed the wiring.

Report from FaeAnn--There are smaller grants and smaller money in our budgets, at this time. Those applying for grants must go to a school, that is held each year. Elected Officials must apply for grants. We need two 4 wheel drive Hot Shot trucks.

The Five-County money will carry over to the next year. The County budget will be about the same as this year. We will not open between Christmas and New Years, this year. Senior Day at the Legislature will be Feb. 13, 2014. It would be nice if some people from our area could attend.

Due to the road closure, the food for Kanab will leave Orderville, 1 ½ hours earlier. We will be hiring a part time driver for Meals on wheels, for the winter.

A representative from the State Council on Aging visited the Orderville Center. She was impressed. We have not received an official report.

Care and Share report—We gave out 10,275 lbs. of food. We are getting more families who need Food, all of the time. The Park Closure brought more people to our area. Emergency food is available anytime, not just on designated days. Our local supplies are still good.

Commissioner Matson is treating us to a Breakfast at Parry Lodge, Jan. 3rd at 9:00 a.m.
