KANE COUNTY JAIL VISITATION RULES

- 1. Any person who has criminal charges pending in any court in Kane County will not be allowed to visit any inmate.
- 2. Any person who is on probation from any court or through AP&P will not be allowed to visit any inmate.
- 3. Visiting is a privilege. This privilege applies to both inmate and visitor. This privilege can be revoked for any inappropriate activities or rule violations by either party. Depending on the circumstance, the revocation could be permanent.
- 4. Visiting days and times for the Kane County Jail are:

Wednesdays from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (Noon) Sundays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (Noon)

- 5. Visiting times are subject to change.
- 6. Visits may be limited to fifteen (15) minutes depending on the number of visitors.
- 7. Only persons on the inmate's "approved visitor list" will be allowed to visit.
- 8. Visitors are limited to one (1) visit per visiting day.
- 9. Items brought in for the inmate from visitors, except money, will not be accepted unless approved in writing by the jail administration.
- 10. Any money brought in should be in the form of a cashier's check or money order addressed to the inmate. Cash is also accepted but not recommended. **Personal checks are not accepted.**
- 11. No one under the age of 18 years will be allowed to visit unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- 12. Visits will take place using the jail's video visitation system.
- 13. Visitors are to be modestly dressed. If dressed in revealing clothing, the visitor may not be allowed to visit.
- 14. Attorneys, bail bondsman, and designated others may be allowed a barrier visit depending on circumstance.

- 15. Contact visits are not allowed except under very limited circumstances and approved by the jail administration (Sgt. or above).
- 16. Only one (1) inmate and two (2) visitors at one time will be allowed at the visiting stations without prior approval of the jail staff.
- 17. Visitors must show a Photo I.D. of themselves (i.e. a valid driver's license).
- 18. Persons who just "drop in" to visit an inmate will be turned away.
- 19. Special visits can be arranged to accommodate circumstances such as long distances of travel (more than one hundred (100) miles one (1) way). The inmate must request this type of visit in writing and the request must be approved by the jail administration prior to the visit. The visitor must be on the inmate's approved visitor list.
- 20. No food, drinks, smoking or electronic devices are allowed in the visitation room. **See** rule #3.
